NCC 2022 is available on the Australian Buildings Codes Board website.

Content

The Australian Building Codes Board (ABCB) has announced that NCC 2022 is now available on [NCC Online](#).

NCC 2022 will be adopted on 1 May 2023, with a transition period to 1 October 2023 for the modern homes provisions for energy efficiency, condensation mitigation and livable (accessible) housing.

Until these adoption dates, NCC 2019 Amendment 1 remains in force.

Although NCC 2022 is available, until its adoption on 1 May 2023 it will still be necessary to meet the requirements of NCC 2019 Amendment 1.
